Our Mission

Chester County Futures, Inc. is a nine-year-old 501(c)3 non-profit academic, mentoring, and scholarship organization serving 130+ low-income 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th graders from Chester County whose socio-economic plight places them at grave risk of dropping out of high school. These are bright kids nominated by their school counselors. If their personal circumstances were different, they could easily earn a diploma. Instead, through no fault of their own, they face an unfair share of roadblocks.

Our Three-Pronged Program Outreach

► **Academic enrichment:** 43 curriculum topics and dozens of individualized topics are covered in bi-weekly school-based sessions led by three CCF program coordinators. In addition, students give back to their hometown areas by taking part in an array of CCF-sponsored community service projects.

Goal: To arm disadvantaged students with the academic and societal tools they need to succeed academically and economically on a par with their more advantaged peers.

Result: Improvement in standardized test scores, grades, school attendance, and SAT scores.

► **Mentoring:** In 2005-2006 dozens of volunteer mentors from all walks of life will serve as guest presenters in our classrooms, offering advice, advocacy, wisdom and encouragement. This mentor-rich classroom environment brings students face-to-face with reliable, trustworthy role models. We also recruit job shadowing mentors so the students can explore career options. Students who lack role models at home are paired with one-to-one mentors who provide personal guidance and friendship over several years. All of this support from the surrounding community sends our students a deeper message as well: That they are not alone. Often they ask about the people and the businesses whose dollars underwrite their program and their scholarships. They relish opportunities to meet benefactors. It is very personal for them. They want to know names and they like seeing pictures of donors.

► **Scholarship Assistance:** Upon completion of our high school program, students earn up to \$6,000 in scholarship funds for their higher education. We help them with SAT prep and with college and financial aid applications, keep tabs on them during their college years, advocate as needed, and cheer them along.

The Payoff: 100% high school graduation; 83% college retention

Despite the odds, an astounding 100% of our CCF students earn their high school diplomas, 76 students to date. To top it off, their college/post-secondary retention and graduation rate is 83% — more than double the national 41%* college retention/graduation rate for low-income students; and 33% better than the 50% national average for all college students. * 2004 US Dept. of Education data

Our Investment: Eight Years and \$24,000

We devote eight years of service to our students, providing everything from instructional support and financial aid, to human service linkages and positive-peer team building. We invest \$24,000 per student: \$4,500 a year for the four high school years they are with us; \$1,500 a year during four college years.

Buys **your** student some basic school supplies.

Buys a series of books **your** student needs to take part in our literacy-boosting classes.
- Points to Success \$140
Your student will earn points all year for grades attendance, community service, etc. Each marking period, **your** student's points will be converted to a cash stipend funded by **you**.
- Mentor Match Program..... \$200
Through **your** support, **your** student will interact with mentors (adult role models) during the year.
- Community Service Projects.....\$50
Your student will take part in up to 4 community service projects to convey the value of giving back.
